State Housing Policy Advisory Committee to Meet

FRANKFORT, Ky.—The Commonwealth of Kentucky’s Housing Policy Advisory Committee (HPAC) will hold a full committee meeting at 1:30 p.m. ET, on Tuesday, April 23, 2019, at the Kentucky Housing Corporation, 1231 Louisville Road, Frankfort, Kentucky. The agenda for this meeting is below.

The HPAC was created by the 1996 General Assembly under the Affordable Housing Act. The HPAC, consisting of 29 members representing the public and private sectors, has the responsibility of addressing and assessing issues that have a direct impact on housing in the Commonwealth. The HPAC advises the officers and directors of Kentucky Housing Corporation on state housing policy matters. The Corporation annually reports the findings and recommendations of the HPAC to the governor and the interim Joint Committee on Local Government of the Legislative Research Commission.
