These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the Kentucky Housing Corporation.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about March 24, 2025, the Kentucky Housing Corporation (KHC) will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of HOME-ARP funds under Section 3205 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (P.L. 117-2) ("ARP") to undertake the following project:

Project Title: Brighton Supportive Housing

Purpose: The proposed Brighton Supportive Housing project, located at scattered sites on Ann Street, Roberts St, and Brighton St, in Newport, Campbell County, Kentucky, will consist of twelve units, including 1BR, 2BR, and 3BR units. The units will be in either single-family or duplex style houses. All houses will be brick exterior cladding with a pitched roof and either single- or two-story following KHC's Minimum Design Standards for New Construction of Single-Family Dwelling Units. This configuration will accommodate its broad target population of families or individuals who are homeless or at risk of homelessness, with some units set aside specifically for veterans.

Location: Vacant parcels of 118 West 7th Street (39.08867, -84.49592), 710/712 Ann Street (39.08834, -84.49594), 722 Ann Street (39.08813, -84.49571), 730 Ann Street (39.08793, -84.49557), 732/734 Ann Street (39.08788, -84.49553), and 733 Ann Street (39.08802, -84.49524)

Estimated Costs: Estimated HOME-ARP funding of \$4,026,014 and \$250,000 in private funds for an estimated total development cost of \$4,276,014.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The KHC has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Kentucky Housing Corporation, Attention: Winston Miller, Executive Director, 1231 Louisville Road. Frankfort, KY 40601 or via email at environmentalreview@kyhousing.org. All comments received by March 23, 2025, will be considered by the Kentucky Housing Corporation prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. **Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.**

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The KHC certifies to HUD that Winston Miller in his capacity as Executive Director consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows KHC to use program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the KHC's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the KHC; (b) the KHC has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD Louisville Field Office, Attn: Acting Director Erik Hoglund at 601 W. Broadway, Room 110, Louisville, Kentucky 40202 or via email at LouisvilleRROF@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
