2026 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Local Competitive Application Scoring, Ranking, and Reallocation Process “Local Application Guidelines”

Approved by the KY BoS CoC Advisory Board on July 6, 2026

This document includes the funding priorities and description of the scoring criteria, ranking, and reallocation process used by the Kentucky Balance of State Continuum of Care (KY BoS CoC) to score and rank Renewal and New Project Applications for inclusion in the KY BoS CoC’s 2026 Consolidated Application to HUD for the 2026 CoC Program Competition. Sample scoresheets containing the specific criteria used to evaluate projects can be found on the FY 2026 CoC Competition page of Kentucky Housing Corporation’s website.

I. Purpose:

On June 1, 2026, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) released the FY 2026 Continuum of Care Competition (CoC) and Youth Homeless Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grants Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). Local CoCs are charged with overseeing local competitions to select projects for inclusion in each CoC's Consolidated Application to HUD. The Consolidated Application is comprised of the CoC Application, which is completed by the CoC's Collaborative Applicant on behalf of the full CoC, individual project applications, and a Priority Listing (i.e., ranking) of projects for HUD's consideration.

As part of this FY26 CoC Program Competition, the Kentucky Balance of State CoC (KY BoS CoC) is seeking project applicants committed to local and HUD policy priorities to ensure homelessness in Kentucky is rare, brief, and non-recurring, including:

- Renewal applicants;
- First-time applicants;
- Organizations not currently receiving CoC funding;
- Organizations serving victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking;
- Youth providers; and
- Faith-based organizations

All interested project applicants within the 118 counties of the KY BoS CoC, including current direct recipients, Kentucky Housing Corporation (KHC) subrecipients applying for renewal funding, and all new project applicants, are expected to read the HUD CoC NOFO and these local application guidelines to ensure the project's design is consistent with HUD and KY BoS CoC policy priorities and requirements.

The KY BoS CoC Advisory Board charged the Scoring and Ranking Committee with developing a process and selection criteria to evaluate and rank projects per HUD's instructions and policy priorities as outlined in the NOFO. Using the approved criteria contained in this document, projects will be scored and ranked by the KY BoS CoC's Collaborative Applicant, KHC. The ranking will be shared publicly and with the KY BoS Advisory Board for its approval prior to submission to HUD.

This document will outline the process and priorities that will be utilized by the KY BoS CoC when scoring and ranking projects in the local CoC competition to be included on the Priority Listing submitted to HUD. Applicants should carefully read this document as the KY BoS CoC has established additional project eligibility and selection criteria beyond what is outlined by HUD in the NOFO.

The scoring criteria are intended to prioritize projects based on performance outcomes associated with achieving CoC system-wide goals and commitment to HUD and local policy priorities. The ranking of projects based on the objective scoring criteria may result in funding being reallocated from lower performing renewal projects to higher performing projects or to new projects better aligned with policy priorities that will improve the CoC's overall performance and better respond to the needs of persons experiencing homelessness in the Balance of State.

II. HUD and KY BoS CoC Goals and Funding Priorities

A. HUD Goals and Objectives

Applicants should review Section III. B. of HUD’s CoC NOFO for more complete information on HUD’s goals and objectives. Below is a listing of these goals:

1. Improving Outcomes
2. Creating Competition to Improve Innovation and Accountability
3. Restoring Balance to the Continuum of Care
4. Prioritizing Treatment and Recovery as a Means to Self-Sufficiency
5. Promoting Economic Self-Sufficiency
6. Advancing Public Safety for All
7. Minimizing Trauma for Vulnerable Populations
8. Expanding Access Based on Merit and Not Ideology

B. HUD’s Tiering and Selection Process

I. HUD’s Tiering Requirement

HUD is again requiring CoCs to rank all projects (new and renewal, except for Planning) into two tiers through a local competition process. The tiers are to be structured as follows:

- **Tier 1 is equal to 60 percent of the CoC’s Annual Renewal Demand (ARD)**
- **Tier 2 is equal to 40 percent of the CoC’s ARD plus the amount of funds available through the CoC Bonus and the Domestic Violence (DV) Bonus set-aside.**

ARD is the amount of funding a CoC is eligible to renew through the CoC competition. The total is calculated from the award amounts for all current CoC projects with grant expiration dates in calendar year 2027, including projects funded through the FY 2025 award process and Special NOFO (SNOFO) projects renewing for the first time. The KY BoS CoC’s FY 2026 estimated ARD is equal to approximately \$23,547,571 from 78 renewal projects. **The amounts listed below are subject to change slightly.**

II. Projects Ranked by CoCs in Tier 1 – HUD’s Selection Process

Per HUD’s FY 2026 CoC NOFO, projects ranked by CoCs in Tier 1 will be conditionally selected by HUD from the highest scoring CoC to the lowest scoring CoC, provided the project applications pass both HUD eligibility and threshold review as well as HUD’s risk review described in Section V.C. of the NOFO. Projects ranked in Tier 1 will not have to compete against other projects across the country like projects in Tier 2 will be required to do.

III. Projects Ranked by CoCs in Tier 2 – HUD’s Selection Process

This year’s Tier 2 HUD selection process is different, in part, from previous competitions so applicants should review information contained in this section carefully.

Projects (including new DV Bonus and YHDP renewal projects) ranked by the CoC in Tier 2 will be selected in part by funding source (e.g., DV Bonus or non-DV-Bonus), in part by project component type (new TH and new SSO prioritized), and in part by HUD Tier 2 project score as described by HUD in Section V.D. of the NOFO.

A. Set-Aside for New Transitional Housing and New Supportive Services Only Projects in Tier 2

As part of the FY 2026 CoC NOFO, HUD has established a set-aside of \$1.3 billion for new projects ranked in Tier 2 with an explicit priority for new Transitional Housing (TH) and new Supportive Services Only (SSO) projects. This new project set-aside with HUD’s significant prioritization of new TH and new SSO projects largely informs the KY BoS CoC’s local policies for Tier 2 ranking.

B. HUD will follow the following sequence to select projects from Tier 2 until available funds are exhausted.

1. HUD will first select projects seeking new DV Bonus funding. Selection will be based on HUD Tier 2 project-level score compared to other new DV Bonus projects nationally. HUD will select new DV Bonus projects from highest scoring to lowest until no DV Bonus funds remain. If a project seeking DV Bonus funding is not selected for the DV Bonus set-aside, it will remain on the list for consideration for non-DV Bonus funding following the process below.
2. HUD will next review PH projects across the nation to determine if \$430 million has been awarded to PH projects that serve families with children from projects ranked in Tier 1 and those selected for the DV Bonus set-aside. If this amount has not been reached, HUD will select additional PH projects from Tier 2 that serve families with children until \$430 million is reached.
3. HUD will then select **NEW TH and NEW SSO projects ranked in Tier 2** in order of HUD Tier 2 project score until the \$1.3 billion set-aside has been reached.
4. If the \$1.3 billion has not been reached after selecting all new TH and new SSO projects, HUD will continue down the list in order of HUD Tier 2 project score until \$1.3 billion in new projects has been reached.

5. If funds remain after selecting all new projects in Tier 2, only then will HUD select renewal projects in order of HUD Tier 2 project score.
- C. Projects in Tier 2 will be scored by HUD on a 100-point scale. This is referred to as the HUD Tier 2 project score. The 100 point-scale is based on the following categories:**
1. **CoC Score:** Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the score received by the KY BoS CoC on the “CoC Application”—the application KHC submits to HUD on behalf of the full CoC geographic area capturing the CoC’s system-level performance and collective efforts. The “CoC Application” is separate from individual “project applications”.
 2. **CoC Project Ranking:** Up to 40 points for the CoC’s ranking of the project application(s) in Tier 2 (i.e., where a project is placed in Tier 2).
 3. **Service Participation Requirements:** Up to 10 points for projects that have or will incorporate supportive service participation requirements in their program design, based on individual need in accordance with 24 CFR 578.75(h).

III. Local Competition Policies

As stated in the previous section, 60 percent of the KY BoS CoC’s ARD amount equals \$14,128,543. The CoC currently has nearly \$19 million worth of permanent housing (PH) projects eligible for renewal that are serving program participants (PSH, RRH, and Joint TH-RRH) – exceeding the amount allowed by HUD in Tier 1 by approximately \$5 million.

Furthermore, with approximately \$4.04 billion for HUD to award nationally across nearly 400 CoCs (including for CoC Planning dollars), the amount of funds available for Tier 2 projects across all CoCs is roughly the same amount as HUD’s \$1.3 billion set-aside for new projects ranked in Tier 2, which HUD has stated will be used first for new TH and new SSO projects. This means it is highly likely that very few if any renewal projects (regardless of component type, including renewal TH and SSO) ranked in Tier 2 or new PH projects ranked in Tier 2 (excluding new DV Bonus RRH) will be selected by HUD for funding.

While the KY BoS CoC is committed to offering a range of project types to meet the varying needs of those experiencing homelessness, it is also the goal to retain as many permanent housing beds as possible as part of that offering, especially for people with the highest level of need including those with disabilities and those experiencing chronic homelessness.

In light of the above facts, the KY BoS CoC has adopted the following local policies for this FY 2026 CoC Competition. Applicants must read these policies carefully prior to submitting applications:

- a. The KY BoS CoC will only accept new project applications for new TH and new SSO projects (SSO-Stand-alone or SSO-Street Outreach) from applicants seeking non-DV Bonus funds.
- b. The KY BoS CoC will only accept new project applications for new TH and new RRH projects from applicants seeking DV Bonus funds.

- c. The KY BoS CoC will not accept any new project applications for new permanent housing projects, including new Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) or new Rapid Rehousing (RRH), with the exception of new RRH projects seeking funding through HUD's DV Bonus set-aside. HUD is not accepting new project applications for Joint TH-RRH projects.
- d. Current TH, SSO (SSO-Standalone, SSO-Street Outreach, and SSO-Coordinated Entry), and Joint TH-RRH projects (including those originally funded through YHDP, SNOFO, and previous DV Bonus set-asides) are not eligible to submit renewal project applications through this competition. This decision is driven by the limited amount of funds available in Tier 1 and HUD's explicit prioritization of selecting new TH and new SSO projects in Tier 2. These projects (current TH, SSO, or Joint TH-RRH) may elect to submit new project applications for either new TH or new SSO (SSO-Standalone or SSO-Street Outreach) projects using funds reallocated from their current TH, SSO, or Joint TH-RRH project.
- e. Current TH and SSO (Standalone and Street Outreach) are permitted to submit new project applications for the same component type as their current project from which they are reallocating funds. This is an opportunity to realign proposed budgets and to improve project design, if needed, to incorporate HUD and KY BoS CoC goals and priorities as appropriate.
- f. The only projects that will be ranked in Tier 1 are CoC "Infrastructure" projects (described in IV of this document), current PSH projects eligible for renewal, and current RRH projects eligible for renewal.
- g. All PSH projects eligible for renewal will be ranked in Tier 1 in order of score following the CoC Infrastructure projects so long as the project does not have any outstanding, significant HUD or KHC monitoring findings without an approved corrective action plan in place and so long as the project scores above 65 percent.
- h. RRH projects eligible for renewal will be ranked in the order of score starting in Tier 1 following PSH projects.
- i. Due to the limited funding available for Tier 1, some RRH projects will initially fall into Tier 2 after all projects are scored and ranked. RRH projects falling into Tier 2 after initial scoring and ranking must reallocate the RRH's renewal project funding to a new TH or new SSO project or elect not to apply for a new project at all. Applicants reallocating from a RRH project to a new TH or SSO project after initial ranking must submit a new project application for the new project component. KHC will provide applicants with technical assistance through this process.

- j. New TH and SSO projects in Tier 2 that were created by current recipients and KHC-subrecipients from funds reallocated from projects not seeking renewal will be ranked above entirely new projects not created from reallocation.
- k. With the exception of new TH and SSO projects created from reallocated funds from current SSO-CE projects, all other new TH and SSO projects in Tier 2 that were created by current recipients and KHC-subrecipients from funds reallocated from projects not seeking renewal will be scored based on the performance of the renewal project from which they are reallocating funds to create the new project. New TH and SSO projects created from funds reallocated from SSO-CE projects will be scored using the new project scoresheet for which component type is being created.
- l. Entirely new projects **not** created by current recipients and KHC subrecipients in order to convert an existing project to a new project will be ranked in Tier 2 along with other entirely new projects based on local project score. New projects in this grouping will be ranked in Tier 2 below the projects listed in Category j. above. Entirely new projects in this category will be scored using the New Project Scoresheet.

Important Note About New Projects

New projects created through Reallocation (including Transition Grants), the CoC Bonus, or the DV Bonus must meet the project eligibility and project quality thresholds established in sections V.A.4.a and V.A.4.c of the CoC NOFO. The criteria, which for some project types is considerably different than previous years, begins on page 62 of the CoC NOFO. Applicants must carefully review these criteria and incorporate the expectations into the project design of new projects.

The KY BoS CoC has adopted the following additional policies:

- m. **New Projects Requesting Capital Costs Not Accepted:** While eligible under the CoC Interim Rule, capital funding for construction, acquisition, and rehabilitation is not renewable and cannot be reallocated to other projects in future CoC competitions. **Therefore, the KY BoS CoC will not allow new projects to request funding for these capital cost activities.**
- n. **New Project Budget Request Limit:** To ensure as many new projects as possible can be included, the KY BoS CoC is limiting the budget request of entirely new projects to no more than \$750,000 (excluding DV Bonus projects and new projects created due to the conversion of RRH or Joint TH-RRH projects). In the event not all available funds are requested after all other applications are submitted, new project applicants may be offered the opportunity to increase final budget requests. An entirely new project means one not created from the reallocation of funds from a current project no longer renewing as is
- o. **New Projects Created Through Reallocation:** New projects created with reallocated funding by current recipients and KHC subrecipients may request a budget amount that is more than the amount currently awarded for the project that is not renewing and still retain ranking in Tier 2

above entirely new projects not created from reallocation. To retain this higher ranked position, applicants can request up to 100 percent more or \$50,000 more, whichever amount is less. Alternatively, applicants can request an even higher amount but will then be scored as an entirely new project and ranked alongside other entirely new projects in Tier 2.

- p. **New Project Applicants as KHC Subrecipients:** Applicants who do not currently or who have not received CoC funding from any Kentucky CoC since FY 2020 must apply for a new project as a KHC subrecipient. This will allow KHC to provide direct technical assistance and administrative guidance to the new applicant, including during project application, start up, and throughout implementation.
- q. Expansion: The only project type eligible for expansion is currently-funded DV Bonus RRH projects seeking new DV Bonus RRH funding.
- r. To apply for a DV Bonus project, the applicant must be a [member of ZeroV](#), Kentucky's intimate partner violence coalition.
- s. The KY BoS CoC reserves the right to amend the restrictions listed above in the event not all Reallocation and/or Bonus funds have been claimed by other new projects.

IV. Tier 1 Projects

As stated in the previous section, the KY BoS CoC has elected to prioritize the following projects for inclusion in Tier 1.

A. BoS-wide Infrastructure Projects:

The **Kentucky Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)** and the **KY BoS Coordinated Entry System (CES)** are both required components of the CoC to comply with HUD requirements for both the CoC and Emergency Solutions Grant Programs (ESG). All CoC and ESG-funded projects in addition to other federal programs (SSVF and RHY) are required to enter data into HMIS and to participate in coordinated entry. The CoC's HMIS is administered by KHC. Having a high performing HMIS and CES are necessary components of a CoC's infrastructure. A portion of the HMIS funds are awarded annually to the state DV Coalition, ZeroV, to support the requirement of ESG and CoC-funded Victim Services Providers (VSPs) to utilize an HMIS-comparable database. Through the CES grant, KHC recently launched a CE call center available to people in all 118 counties of the BoS to provide access to the CE and other resources.

In addition, **KHC's Housing Connector SSO** grant funded for the first time through the FY22 Special NOFO provides assistance to partners across the BoS, including systems beyond CoC and ESG, in connecting people experiencing homelessness with housing – providing vital system navigation services in addition to other supports vital to obtaining and maintaining housing. These services benefit all partners and allow the CoC to have a broader reach and impact, especially in areas with few services and with systems such as public housing agencies (PHAs), the Veterans Administration (VA), and private landlords.

Therefore, the following ranking policy will be followed:

- HMIS grants will be ranked at the top of Tier 1.
- KHC's SSO-CE renewal project will be ranked in Tier 1 immediately after the HMIS projects.
- KHC's SSO Housing Connector project will be placed in Tier 1 immediately following the KY BoS CoC SSO-CE grant.

B. PSH Renewal Projects:

PSH projects serve program participants with the highest level of need who need long-term housing assistance and supportive services. PSH cannot be easily replaced with other CoC-eligible program components. To preserve limited PSH in the KY BoS CoC, all PSH projects will be ranked in Tier 1 following CoC Infrastructure projects in order of score so long as the project does not have any outstanding, significant HUD or KHC monitoring findings without an approved corrective action plan in place and so long as the project scores above 65 percent.

C. RRH Renewal Projects:

In order to preserve limited funding for RRH projects currently serving program participants and that provide communities with time-limited resources to help people get off the streets, flee domestic violence, and exit emergency shelters and transitional housing projects, current RRH projects are eligible to be ranked in Tier 1 following PSH projects.

Due to limited funding allowed in Tier 1, some RRH renewal projects will fall into Tier 2. RRH projects that fall into Tier 2 after initial ranking must convert their project to either a new TH or new SSO project or elect to no longer seek funding. These newly created TH and SSO projects will retain the same rank position in Tier 2 as they did based on their original RRH project score.

As noted in Section V. below, all renewal projects, including PSH and RRH and except those excluded, will be scored using criteria approved by the CoC Board.

V. Renewal Scoring Criteria and Ranking Process

Each project type will be scored in comparison to other projects within the same category.

All renewal projects, except for CoC Infrastructure projects listed in Section IV of this document, will be scored by KHC staff using a renewal scoring rubric approved by the Scoring and Ranking Committee and CoC Board available on the 2026 CoC Competition page of the KHC website.

Projects will be initially ranked from highest to lowest based on the score each project receives on the scoresheet. All renewal projects, excluding the exceptions outlined in Section IV, will be ranked based on project performance, capacity, and commitment to HUD and local policy priorities. Complete scoring criteria can be found on the sample scoresheets on KHC's website. ***Renewal project scoring criteria***

includes 1) Returns to homelessness, 2) Increasing employment income, and 3) Service participation requirements.

Data Sources (including for Victim Service Providers serving survivors of domestic violence)

Almost all the data used to evaluate renewal projects will come from HMIS or an HMIS-comparable database for Victim Service Providers (VSP). Additional information will be gathered from project applications (both KHC and e-snaps). Annual Performance Reports (APRs) for the period **July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026 will be used by KHC to evaluate client-level outcomes.** Again this year, to expedite the scoring process, KHC will run these reports for all non-VSP renewal projects. All applicants must still ensure data is accurate and complete.

VI. New Project Application Scoring Criteria and Ranking Process

HUD is allowing the creation of new projects through Reallocation, CoC Bonus, and DV Bonus funding. As stated in Section III. E. of this document, **the KY BoS CoC will accept new project applications for the following program components only: TH and SSO (Standalone or Street Outreach) for non-DV Bonus projects and new TH or RRH for new DV Bonus projects.**

NOTE: Expansion Projects are technically considered new projects by HUD but will be scored by the KY BoS CoC using a separate scoring rubric than the one used for entirely new projects. Expansion scoring criteria is discussed in the next section.

2026 KY BoS New Project Funding Priorities and Requirements:

Service Participation:

New projects must require participants to participate in supportive services.

Project Need:

Applicants will be expected to use quantitative data to justify the need for the proposed project.

Commitment to Moving People Quickly into Permanent Housing:

Applicants will be expected to describe a strong plan to move people into permanent housing quickly.

Housing Stability:

Applicants will be expected to describe a strong plan to ensure participants maintain housing stability and do not return to homelessness, even after CoC assistance ends.

Connection to Mainstream Benefits:

Applicants' commitment to connecting participants with mainstream resources.

Increasing employment:

Applicant's plan to increase participant's income, particularly through employment.

Program Management, Capacity, and CoC Participation:

Applicants will be required to complete the KHC Capacity Scorecard, which includes threshold and self-certification questions relating to program management, financial controls, and experience

administering federal housing programs. In addition, applicants will receive points on the extent to which they have participated in the KY BoS CoC.

VII. Expansion Project Scoring Criteria and Ranking Process

Eligible renewal projects proposing to expand their existing projects will use the scoresheet specifically for expansion projects. While HUD considers expansion projects to be “new”, the KY BoS CoC will use largely client-level performance-based criteria for expansion projects.

The performance-based criteria used to score expansion projects mirrors the criteria used for renewal project applications. For expansion projects, emphasis is placed on percent of clients exiting to permanent housing, unit utilization rate, expenditure rates for current renewal projects, and justification of project need.

Only DV Bonus RRH projects are eligible to submit expansion applications during this funding round.

VIII. DV Bonus Project Scoring Criteria and Ranking Process

Projects applying through the DV Bonus will be scored using a scoresheet like the new project scoresheet with additional questions relating to experience serving the population required to be served by DV Bonus projects as well as plans to implement the project. **New DV Bonus projects, with the exception of new DV Bonus RRH and new DV Bonus TH projects created to replace renewal DV Bonus RRH projects that initially fall into Tier 2 or renewal DV Bonus Joint TH-RRH ineligible to renew, will be ranked in Tier 2 in order of score as compared to other entirely new projects not created through reallocation (including non-DV Bonus new projects).**

IX. Additional Policies and Considerations

Once KHC completes the scoring and ranking, the following additional factors may be considered. The rationale for any adjustments must be made to the KY BoS CoC Advisory Board when the recommended ranking is presented to them for approval.

- a. The CoC may seek to preserve low-ranking projects at risk of losing funding where those projects represent the only CoC Program funding in their communities or where the CoC resources available are demonstrably inadequate based on quantitative data.
- b. KHC reserves the right to submit one or more projects to ensure the CoC requests the full amount available to the CoC. Any entirely new projects submitted under this clause will be ranked in Tier 2 based on score along with other entirely new projects.
- c. The CoC may consider reducing funding requests as a means to preserve funding for higher ranked projects and the Continuum, if needed.
- d. The CoC may consider reducing budget amounts for projects automatically ranked in Tier 1 as a means to ensure more projects are ranked in Tier 1.

- e. The CoC may further cap new and expanded project budget requests in order to allow as many new projects to be submitted to HUD as possible in order to achieve better geographic coverage across the 118-county CoC or for other strategic reasons approved by the Scoring and Ranking Committee and the CoC Advisory Board.
- f. The KY BoS CoC reserves the right to modify this document as needed to correct any errors or omissions.
- g. The KY BoS CoC reserves the right to modify the process and scoring and ranking criteria if it is deemed necessary due to changes or clarifications in the overall process made by HUD or information not considered at the time of the document's original approval. Any policy changes made to this document after the initial Board-approved process will require a recommendation by the Scoring and Ranking Committee.

X. Timeline

- a. **July 3: Intent to Apply forms due to KHC.**
- b. **July 6:** Scoring and Ranking Criteria Approved by CoC Board.
- c. **July 13:** Renewal project HMIS/VSP Comparable Database APRs due to KHC.
- d. **July 23: Project Application Submission to CoC for KHC Subrecipients: For KHC sub-recipients, all project information requested by KHC must be submitted to KHC no later than 5:00 p.m. on July 23.** KHC reserves the right to ask for additional information after July 23 to ensure the final project application submitted to HUD is accurate, complete, and competitive. In addition, KHC reserves the right to request information from subrecipients to be submitted prior to July 23.
- e. **July 23: New Applicants and Direct Grantees must submit completed project applications in e-snaps by 5:00 p.m. ET on July 23.** Note when you submit the application, it will be visible to KHC in e-snaps. It will not be submitted to HUD at that time. KHC reserves the right to ask for additional information/corrections to be made in e-snaps after July 23 to ensure the final project application submitted to HUD is accurate, complete, and competitive.
- f. **August 11:** CoC Board Approval of Project Ranking on or before August 11.
- g. **August 11:** Projects notified if they will be included as part of the CoC Consolidated Application on or before August 11.
- h. **August 24-26 (depending on HUD's requirement which has not been published as of the release of this document):** All parts of the Consolidated Application (including priority listing of projects) will be posted on KHC's website.
- i. **August 26 (or earlier):** Consolidated Application Submitted to HUD by KHC on behalf of the KY BoS CoC.

Note: Dates relating to the CoC Advisory Board's approval of Scoring and Ranking Criteria or approval of project rankings are subject to change. Any date changes will be communicated via KHC's eGrams.

XI. Projects not selected for Inclusion

Project applicants that attempted to participate in the CoC's planning process that believe they were denied the right to participate in a reasonable manner may apply directly to HUD by following the procedure found in 24 CFR 578.35.
